Fragrant, lifted, complex, varietal and enticing bouquet. Flavours showcase dark plum and black cherry, some raspberry and ripe cranberry qualities then layers of spice from wood. A stony mineral quality adds complexity enhanced by fruit and course-silk textured tannins and a backbone of acidity. Quite delicious with a fresh appeal and youthful taut mouthfeel. Best drinking from 2025 through 2034.

Estate-grown in the Sound of White Vineyard, in

the upper Waihopai Valley, the classy 2020 vintage was hand-harvested from vines mostly 16 years old, fermented with indigenous yeasts, and matured in French oak barriques (30 per cent new). Deeply coloured, it is full-bodied, with concentrated, youthful, cherryish, plummy flavours, vibrant and supple, and savoury notes adding complexity. Graceful, finely poised and long, it should flourish with cellaring. Best drinking 2023+ 5 Stars. (2020 vintage)

This Single Vineyard Pinot Noir is a good illustration of why Marlborough is a hugely underrated region for pinot. It's got everything fans of this variety are searching for – perfumed aromas and sweet red fruits with a dark, earthy underbelly. Mid to deep cherry in colour, fruits are fleshy and generous. Cherry compote, damp earth and spice with toasty oak in play. The palate is then juicy and savoury – meaty, ground spice flavours over a bed of dark cherry fruits. It's on the oaky side for pinot noir so best matched up with flavoursome dishes such as coq au vin. (2020 vintage)
